# Jonathan Wachter Carbon Cycle Institute of California Lead Soil Scientist

Jonathan is the Lead Soil Scientist at the Carbon Cycle Institute in California where his work focuses on advancing agricultural climate solutions through applied research, policy, and education. He works to integrate agricultural climate solutions into local, regional and statewide climate strategies, build technical assistance capacity and expertise, and equitably scale agricultural climate solutions across California. Jonathan has over a decade of experience in crop and livestock management, land conservation, soil health research, and environmental education. He holds a PhD in soil science from Washington State University with a focus on carbon and nitrogen cycling in diversified agroecosystems.



# Jessica Fox Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI) Senior Technical Executive

Jessica Fox is a Senior Technical Executive at the Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI), a non-profit scientific research organization. Fox led EPRI's Energy Sustainability Interest Group from 2011 through 2016 to become the largest collaborative forum in the industry to strategically advance critical issues related to the sustainable generation and distribution of electricity. She launched EPRI's internal corporate social responsibility program in 2016 and then in 2018 launched the EPRI Power-in-Pollinators Initiative which is the largest effort in North America focused specifically on pollinator conservation at electric power companies. In 2020, she was selected as the single Fortnightly Foremost Innovator in environmental protection in the electric power industry for her work on pollinator research. Her projects have been covered by the Wall Street Journal, The Economist, National Public Radio, Bloomberg, and others. She has a Bachelor's of Science from University of California at Davis, and a Master's of Science from Stanford University and is the EPRI lead for SMUD's Rancho Seco Restorative Energy research program.
