- Normal weather year
- Includes risk mitigations for atypical or unexpected events
- Includes 2024 rate increases

#### Risks

- Increased commodity market volatility
- Continued inflation
- Global supply chain constraints
- Higher interest rates
- Continued economic uncertainty

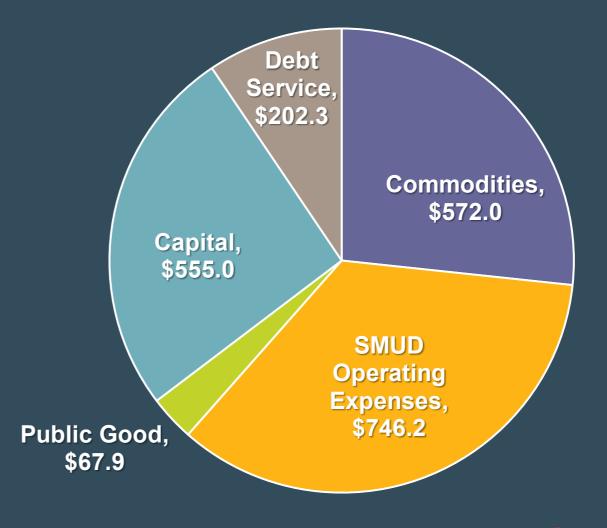

# Commodity Highlights

# Commodity budget funds the cost to provide energy to customers. It is increasing by \$87 million, or 17% to \$572 million

- Continuing issues affecting the commodity budget
  - Weather uncertainty
  - Increased price volatility for both power and gas
  - Increased costs in California's carbon market
- New impacts to the commodity budget
  - Significant cost increase for resource adequacy

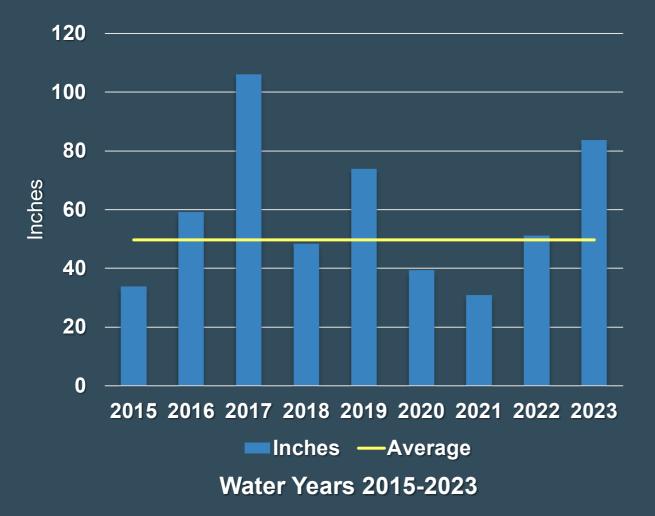
# Increasing mandates and growing competition for renewables and zero carbon resources

- California mandates: achieve 44% Renewable Portfolio Standard (RPS) by 2024 and 52% by 2027
- Other western states, including Oregon and Washington are also adopting energy goals



# Provisions to adjust the budget resolution

Requesting Board approval to increase flexibility in times of uncertainty





Commodity budget is based on a normal water year and planned retail sales GWh.



#### Adjusts automatically for

- Lower precipitation at Upper American River Project (UARP)
- Lower energy deliveries from Western Area Power Administration (WAPA)
- Higher energy sales to customers

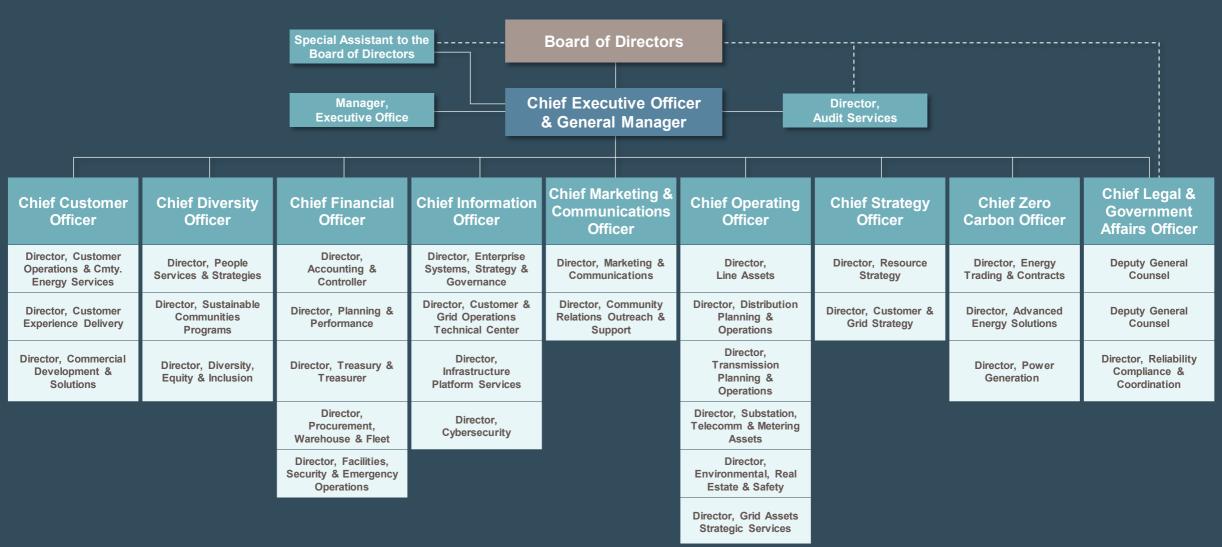

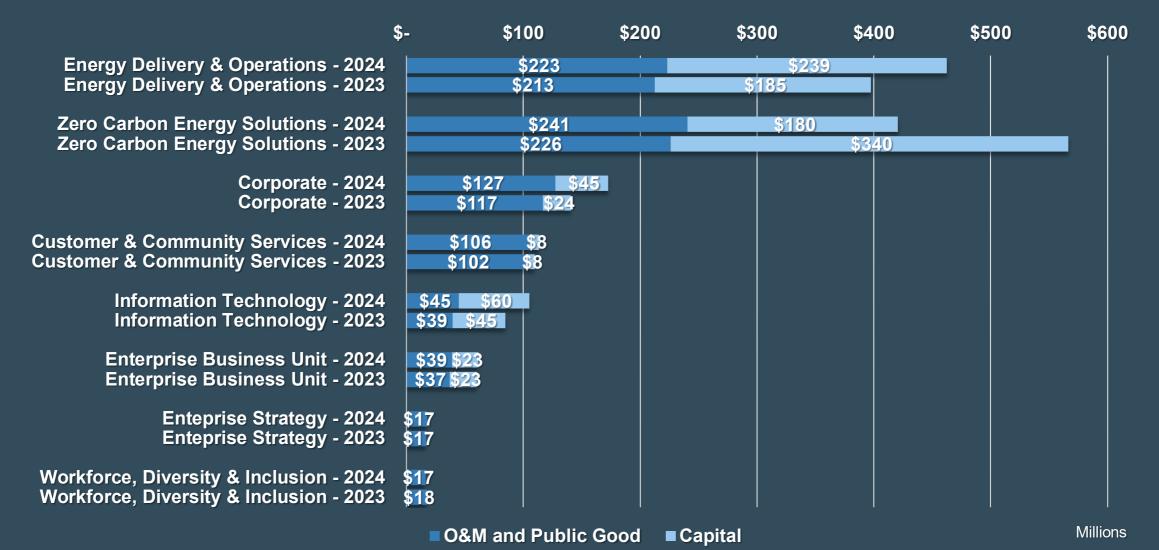

# Operations & Maintenance (O&M) Highlights

SMUD's O&M budget is increasing by \$53 million, or 8% to \$746 million for ongoing costs, including support and business operations



Corrective & preventative maintenance for power generation and grid: \$100 million



Vegetation management & wildfire mitigation: \$53 million



Customer programs, transportation electrification & load mgmt. programs: \$53 million



Community initiatives, including Community Impact Plan: \$21 million



Insurance - Property, casualty & other insurance: \$29 million



## Public Good Highlights

#### SMUD's total budget for public benefit toward clean energy costs is \$107 million

- \$68 million as part of budget authorization, plus \$39 million for rate subsidies
- Total budget decreased by \$3 million, or 3%



**Building electrification**: \$37million



Energy efficiency: \$12 million



Research & development: \$9 million

Public good was defined by California Energy Commission (CEC) in 1996 and many of SMUD's zero carbon program costs not included

Resource Projects: Solano Wind Farm \$51 million, Country Acres Solar and Storage Project \$49 million, Coyote Creek Solar and Storage \$4 million



Long-duration battery energy storage at SMUD's Hedge facility, \$15 million



Substation builds: Elverta and Station H substations, \$46 million



Technology: Grid Resilience and Innovative Partnerships Program (GRIP) grant, \$36 million

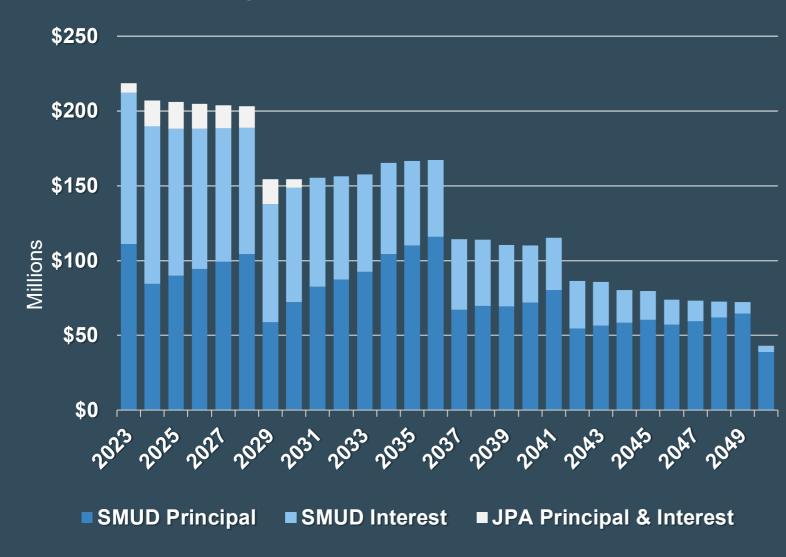

# Debt Management Assumptions & Activity

#### Requesting Board establish additional bonding authority

- Unrestricted cash balance forecast for December 2024: \$577 million, or 150-days cash on hand
- Issue new debt to preserve a 150-day minimum threshold for number of days cash on hand
- 2024 plan assumes \$340 million of new debt
- Establish additional bonding authority: declare intent to issue debt, \$400 million
- During 2024, staff will request Board's authorization for any new transactions

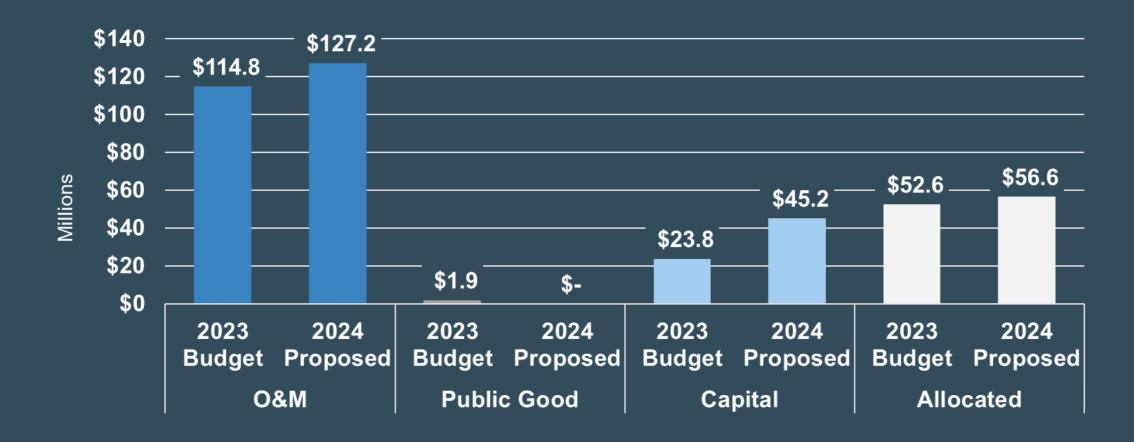

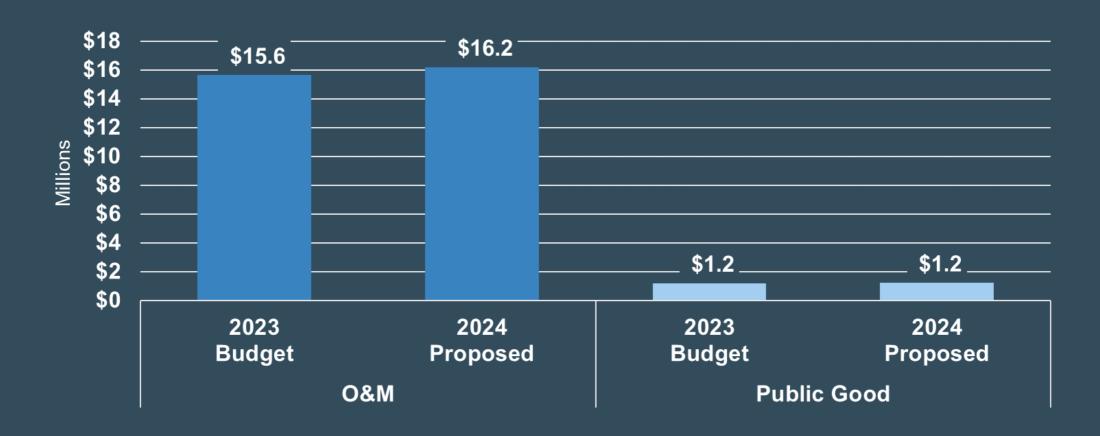

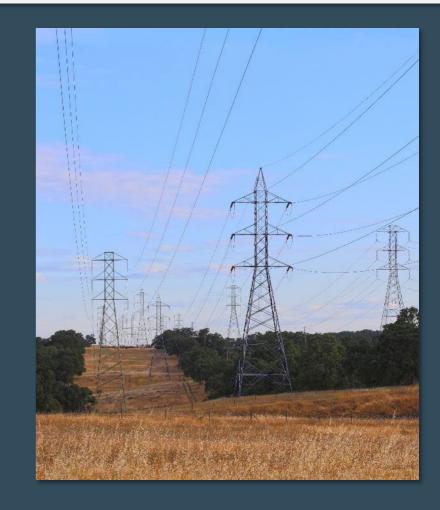
